Reading Program

The 2017 Summer Reading Program will begin Thursday, June 1. The theme this summer is "Build a Better World." The Children's Services Department does not have a required reading list for the Summer Reading Program. Instead, the library is promoting reading for pleasure. The reading program is an enjoyable way to motivate a child to set a reading goal for the summer. Children up to 18 years old are encouraged to select one of two reading logs. On a timed log, the reader records every 15 minutes of reading. On the title log, which is for teens and advance readers, the reader will pick up a bookmark with a list of books. These books have unique characteristics, for example, a book with a blue cover. The reader will record the book titles read that match the list. The reading program ends July 29, 2017, at 1 p.m. For more information, call the library at 361.592.6381.



Reading Rewards

For the timed log, the reader chooses a prize from the treasure chest for every 2½ hours of reading, with a maximum of four prizes per log. For the title log, the reader chooses a prize for every five books read, with a maximum of four prizes per log. Once the log is complete, the child returns the log to the Children's Services Desk and selects a free book from the Prize Cart. In addition, for each completed log turned in, the child fills out an entry form for one of two Amazon Kindle Fire HD. Children who have turned in at least one completed log will be eligible to attend the Reading Reward Party on August 4, 2017.

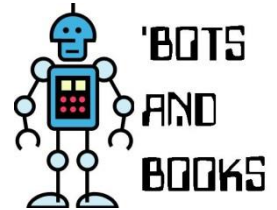
'Bots and Books Lego® Programming
