Library staff members are not able to configure personal wireless devices or troubleshoot equipment that is not WHL property.

Guidelines for Public Wireless Use

- The following are strictly prohibited:
 - Violation of any applicable local statute, or state or federal law
 - Unauthorized copying or use of copyright protected materials
 - Sending, receiving, or displaying text or graphics that may reasonably be construed as either obscene, child pornography, or harmful to minors
 - Compromising the safety and security of a minor or individual when using email, chat rooms, social media or other forms of electronic communication. Such use includes, but is not limited to, giving others private information about one self or others or arranging a face-to-face meeting with an individual one has met on the Internet without a parent or legal guardian's permission.

- Patrons must adhere to the above guidelines regardless if they use their personal device or a library device.
