Author Jacqueline Davies

On Wednesday, November 1, 2017, *The Friends of the Kleberg Public Library* is hosting Ms. Jacqueline Davies, author of *The Lemonade War* series. This series is available in the library's print and digital collections. Her 45-minute presentation, "A Writer's Life" will be from 4:30-5:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall at First Presbyterian Church, 302 W. Kleberg



Ave., Kingsville. For book purchases, attendees will fill out a form to order books, and the author will ship autographed copies. The event is free and open to the public.

Learn more about Jacqueline Davies' works from her bio:

- Ms. Davies has eleven published children's books to her credit.
- Tricking the Tallyman is a historical fiction picture book that tells the hilarious story of one man's attempt to count the people of a town during the taking of the first U.S. Census in 1790.
- Lost is also historical fiction and is written for the young adult reader. It tells the story of a sixteen-year-old girl caught up in the tragedy of the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire.
- The Lemonade War, which is the first book in the Lemonade
 War series, tells the story of a brother and sister who make a
 bet to see who can sell the most lemonade in five days. The
 second book in the series is The Lemonade Crime; the third
 book is The Bell Bandit; the fourth is The Candy Smash; and the
 fifth and final book in the series is The Magic Trap.

Ms. Davies's books have won numerous awards, including the NSTA Outstanding Science Trade Book for Students K-12, the John Burroughs List of Nature Books for Young Readers, The Sigurd Olson Nature Writing Award, the New York Library's Best Books List, the NCSS Notable Social Studies Trade Book for Young People, the IRA/CBC Children's Award Notable Book for Fiction, the Bank Street College of Education's Best Children's Books, and the CCBC Choices Award.

Howdy Authors! Series

Sigifredo Cavazos

On Saturday, November 18, 2017, from 10:30 a.m. to 12 noon, the library will host a book signing with Mr. Sigifredo Cavazos, author of the recently published *The Quest.* Christopher Worth Garcia, the protagonist of *The Quest*, is a troubled Coloradan Vietnam



veteran, who sets out on a quest to find his true identity by coming to Kingsville, Texas, and exploring his father's Chicano roots. In 2012, Mr. Cavazos appeared at the library for his book *Amistad Mountain & Other Stories*, which is available for checkout at the library. Paperback copies of *The Quest* are \$15, and they will be available for purchase at the book signing. This event is free and open to the public.
